NMC intensifies anti-encroachment drive

NASHIK: In response to the escalating issue of encroachment and resulting traffic jams in Nashik, the municipal corporation has launched a special anti-encroachment drive. While residential areas are typically spared during the monsoon season, the municipality has targeted markets and commercial areas for immediate action.

The drive is focusing on various forms of encroachment, including small and large shop signs, plastic coverings, shopkeepers displaying their wares on the streets, and items such as iron nets, boards, chairs, and tables obstructing the roads.

On July 31, under the directives of Municipal Anti-Encroachment Dep-Commissioner Dr. uty

Mayur Patil, enforcement actions were carried out in bustling areas like Shalimar, Main Road, Dhumal Point, Mahatma Gandhi Road, and other locations in both the West and East divisions. The operation resulted in the seizure of about four truckloads of materials, much to the satisfaction of local citizens.

As the encroachment department team arrived on Main Road, many shopkeepers voluntarily cleared their encroachments. Citizens have called for the department to maintain such strict enforcement regularly. Approximately 50 municipal officials and employees participated in this rigorous drive, supported by a strong police presence to ensure order

and security.



Kale remanded to Guidelines for Shravan Somvar Yatra police custody

NASHIK: Arun Kale, the former secretary of the Nashik Agricultural Produce Market Committee, has been remanded to five days of police custody following his arrest for the misappropriation of Rs 90 lakhs. Kale is accused of defrauding the market committee by printing and using fake receipt books.

When Kale was presented in court on Wednesday, the judge ordered his police custody from Monday until August 5.

The Panchavati police station had earlier registered a case against Kale, who allegedly embezzled market committee fees by creating and using fake receipt books in the name of the committee. The Panchavati Police apprehended him for his involvement in this fraudulent scheme, which involved altering official books and collecting fees based on the counterfeit receipt books.


