

Indefinite strike by RTO employees commences Provide facilities for disabled voters:



NASHIK: An indefinite strike by Regional Transport Office (RTO) employees began yesterday, as they seek to address a range of demands. Employees from the Nashik RTO office have joined the strike, which has led to significant disruptions in functioning of the office. However, the issuance of learning and permanent driving licenses, along with vehicle passing, continued at the office.

The RTO State Employees' Association had previously warned of the strike, citing demands that include the implementation of a rota system, immediate promotions, service entry adjustments, cancellation of revenue transfers, and the adoption of the Kalaskar committee's recommendations. Following an unsuccessful meeting with Transport Commissioner Vivek Bhimanwar, employees from nearly 52 regional and sub-regional transport offices across the state participated in the

With participation from approximately 40 to 45 employees at the Nashik office, the premises appeared largely deserted. While senior officers and motor vehicle inspectors remained present. However, several vehicle-related services to come to a halt.

License, vehicle passing works continued

Despite the strike, applications for driving licenses, which are processed online with scheduled appointments, continued. Drivers who had previously secured appointments for learning and permanent licenses arrived at the office for their scheduled tasks. Motor vehicle inspectors managed to conduct some vehicle passing procedures.

No protests

The RTO State Employees' Association's indefinite strike has been started statewide. Association leaders, including president Dnyaneshwar Karanjkar, working president Santosh Naik, and secretary Shireen Shah, were present at the office. Notably, no protests or demonstrations were staged; instead, a notice regarding the strike was placed at the office. An additional board requesting public cooperation during this period was also displayed on the premises.

District Collector to officials

NASHIK: In preparation for the upcoming State Assembly elections, District Collector and District Election Officer Jalai Sharma convened a review meeting yesterday to discuss initiatives aimed at increasing participation among disabled voters in the district. He directed officials to reach out to disabled voters and ensure that all necessary services and facilities are available at polling stations.

During the meeting held in the central hall of the District Collectorate, Collector Sharma emphasized the importance of including tehsils with a significant population of

disabled voters in the electoral process. He instructed voter registration officers to conduct home visits for disabled voters aged over 100, providing them information about voting facilities and encouraging their participation. For those aged 80 to 90, Tehsildars are tasked with following a similar outreach approach.

Sharma urged all relevant authorities to take steps to enhance voter turnout, particularly in areas with historically low participation in State Assembly elections.

As the district gears up for the 2024 elections, there has been a notable increase in voter registration, with 119 new polling stations established. To boost turnout, the Collector advocated for innovative approaches alongside the existing SVEEP (Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation) activities focused on voter awareness.

Recognizing the urban population's significance in influencing voter turnout, Sharma highlighted the need for targeted awareness programs within larger housing complexes and societies. He instructed Municipal Councils and Nagar Parishads to devise a comprehensive public awareness plan to facilitate this outreach.

NASHIK: A Shivshahi bus collided with four to five vehicles near Pinnacle Mall on Nashik-Trimbak Road yesterday due to the driver mistakenly pressing the accelerator instead of the brake. Fortunately, there were no fatalities; however, two to three individuals sustained serious injuries, and two motorcycles were damaged in the

According to reports, as the Shivshahi bus approached Pinnacle Mall from the bus stand, the driver attempted to apply the brakes but inadvertently stepped on the accelerator instead, causing the bus to accelerate unexpectedly. The bus struck four to five vehicles ahead, dragging two motorcycles along with it but narrowly avoiding a more severe outcome. While there were no fatalities, witnesses indicated that some people, including a woman, were injured.
