Efforts by Accreditation Committee to address journalists' issues: Joshi



NASHIK: Efforts are underway to resolve the issues of journalists across Maharashtra through the State Accreditation Committee, stated Yadu Joshi, chairman of the Maharashtra State Newspaper and Media Accreditation Committee, on Saturday. He affirmed that these issues would be addressed through persistent follow-ups with the state government.

The State Accreditation Committee's meeting commenced in Nashik on Saturday, where Nashik Divisional Accreditation Committee chairman Sudhir Lanke, along with members Kiran Lokhande, Abhijit Kulkarni, Vijaysinh Holam, and Chandan Pujadhikari, extended a

warm welcome to the committee's office bearers. Director Hemraj Bagul and Deputy Director of Konkani Division Dr. Ganesh Mule also greeted Chairman Joshi on behalf of the Directorate General of Information and Public Relations.

Joshi highlighted that journalists across the state face several challenges, including issues related to retirement age, obtaining experience certificates for accreditation, and difficulties in acquiring proof of experience for working journalists. He assured that these matters are being actively followed up with the state government. The issue of Sanman Nidhi (honorarium) for senior

journalists has already been resolved through these efforts, he added.

In his welcome address, Lanke expressed optimism that the committee would offer guidance and support to alleviate the challenges journalists face in obtaining accreditation cards. The two-day meeting of the State Accreditation Committee will involve reviewing applications for accreditation and forwarding recommendations to the state government.

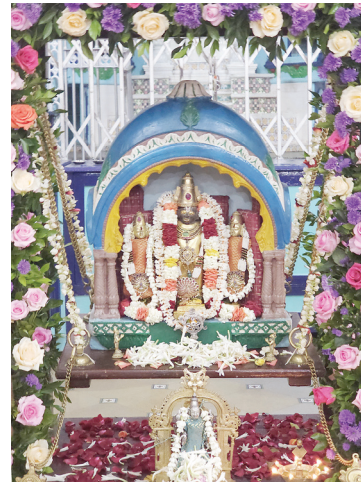

NASHIK: Shalyakas, specialists in ophthalmology, otolaryngology, and dentistry, have long been integral to community healthcare. Nashik's umpires excel in MCA state-level panel exam



NASHIK: Nashik District Cricket Association's umpires Abhishek Jadhav, Akash Sanap, Aman Sharma, and Ratilal Dukle have achieved remarkable success by securing positions on the Maharashtra Cricket Association's (MCA) state-level umpire panel. Their outstanding performance in the MCA's cricket umpire panel examination has brought pride to the Nashik cricket community.

In the entrance test, held in July, more than 450 candidates from across Maharashtra competed. Of the top 68 who qualified for the next written

test, 10 candidates hailed from Nashik. Following the written examination, nine individuals advanced to the practical and oral test stage. Ultimately, four Nashik umpires made the final cut, achieving over 80% marks and securing their place among the 71 selected candidates across Maharashtra.
