CISE School National Outdoor C'ship

AUS students win gold medals



NASHIK: Ashoka Universal School (AUS), Chandshi, has once again demonstrated its sporting prowess as its students delivered outstanding performances at the CISE School National Outdoor Championship, held at Gachibowli Stadium, Hyderabad.

In the under-17 girls category, Ovi Nikam showcased her exceptional talent by clinching two gold medals in the triple jump and long jump events. Her dominant display in both events earned her the prestigious title of Best Athlete in the under-17 category. Nikam triumphed in the triple jump with an impressive leap of 48 metres, and her performance in the long jump secured her a second gold.

Adding to the school's success, Aishwarya Valunj took home the gold medal in the under-17 boys 5 km walk event, while Eshwari Khaire clinched gold in the under-14 girls 4x100 relay.

Both Ovi Nikam and Aishwarya Valunj have been selected for the upcoming 68th School National Championship to be held at Lucknow. They were guided by their athletics coach Balaji Shirphule. The school's principals, Dr. Priya D'Souza and Pramod Tripathi, along with sports teacher Bhupesh Deshmukh, congratulated them and wished them continued success in their future competitions. Coach Shirphule expressed confidence that both Nikam and Valunj will excel in the National Championship.

CM Ladki Bahin Yojana deadline extended

NASHIK: The Chief Minister Ladki Bahin Yojana, launched by the grand alliance government, has brought joy and relief to women, as they have received three installments. Initially, the application deadline for this scheme was set for August 31. However, due to the overwhelming response from women, the submission deadline was extended to September 30. Despite this extension, many women were unable to apply for various reasons. In light of this, the deadline has now been further extended to October 15, and Guardian Minister Dadaji Bhuse has urged women to take advantage of this opportunity. Two installments of the scheme were distributed in August, with the third installment starting to be credited to women's accounts on Sept 29. However, many women faced challenges due to the lack of bank accounts, Aadhaar cards, or other documents. With the new extension, those who have linked their Aadhaar cards to their bank accounts and gathered the required documents can now submit applications.

'King of Clay' Nadal announces retirement

LONDON: Rafael Nadal, the legendary 22-time Grand Slam champion, has announced that he will retire after the upcoming Davis Cup Finals, marking the end of an extraordinary yet injury-riddled career. Nadal, who reigned supreme on clay courts with a record 14 French Open titles, is set to bid an emotional farewell to the sport after more than two decades at the pinnacle.

Rafael Nadal, the 22-time Grand Slam champion, will retire from tennis at the end of this season, the BBC reported.

The 38-year-old will make his final appearance for Spain at November's Davis Cup Finals in Malaga. In a video message released on his social media handle on Thursday, Nadal said: "I am here to let you know I am retiring from professional tennis."

"The reality is that it has been some difficult years, the last two especially," he said.

The 38-year-old Spaniard, widely regarded as one of the greatest tennis

players of all time, confirmed his retirement plans on Thursday, citing ongoing struggles with injury, particularly a hip problem that required surgery and severely limited his appearances in 2023.

"It's been some difficult years, especially the last two," Nadal shared in a heartfelt video posted on social media. "I'm very excited that my last tournament will be the Davis Cup, representing my country. It's a fitting sion, as one of the great moments in the 2004 Davis Cup final in Sevilla." Nadal, who hasn't played since the Paris Olympics in July and missed the US Open and Laver Cup due to fitness concerns, was a surprise inclusion for the Davis Cup Finals in Malaga from November 19-24.

His appearance will close a circle that began with his early triumph in the 2004 Davis Cup. Throughout his illustrious career, Nadal battled numerous injuries, most recently the hip injury, which forced him to miss his beloved French Open.
