

Peth Phata-Moti Super Market road work delayed



NASHIK: The concreting of the two-way single-lane road from Peth Phata to Moti Super Market on Peth Road has been partially completed, but remaining work has been stalled for 20-25 days. This delay is causing inconvenience for commuters, who are urg-

ing authorities to expedite the project.

The road work involves replacing the asphalt stretch from Peth Phata to Phulenagar canal with concrete. While the section from the canal to Moti Super Market is nearly finished, the remaining work toward Peth

Phata is incomplete, forcing vehicles to navigate partially dug-up roads.

The stalled work has led to hazardous conditions, especially at night when streetlights are off. Drivers are forced to use a single lane, increasing the risk of accidents. Residents and motorists are de-

manding immediate action to complete the project and enhance road safety.

Although the one-way concrete road sections are functional, they cannot accommodate larger vehicles like buses and four-wheelers simultaneously. Two-wheeler riders face additional risks of slipping, prompting cautious driving and frequent traffic congestion in the area.

The Rs. 10 crore project has seen partial completion, with gravel rolling and base course concreting underway in some sections. Locals are urging authorities to expedite the remaining work to improve traffic flow and ensure safety.

Mobiles returned to owners



NASHIK: The Anti-Terrorism Cell (ATC) of the Nashik Road police has successfully traced and returned 130 lost and stolen mobile phones to their rightful owners. The phones, worth at approximately Rs 19.45 lakh, were returned to owners on Friday, November 29.

The recovery effort was initiated following directives from Police Commissioner Sandeep Karnik, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Circle II) Monika Raut, and Assistant Commissioner of Police Sachin Bari. They ordered a search for the missing mobiles and in-

structed the investigation of related crimes using the Central Equipment Identity Register (CEIR) portal developed by the government.

Under the guidance of senior inspector Ashok Giri, the ATC team, including havaldar Sandeep Pawar, Vishnu Gosavi, Hemant Medhe, and amaldar Rahul Mehendale, entered the details of complaints filed between 2021 and November 2023 into the CEIR portal.

By analyzing the data from the portal, the team traced 130 mobile phones and successfully returned them to the owners by November 28.

Innovative parenting scheme for adoption launched

Single parents aged 35-60 can now adopt children

NASHIK: In a bid to streamline the adoption process and provide homes to orphaned children, an innovative parenting scheme was introduced in November as part of International Adoption Awareness Month. This new initiative allows couples and single parents to foster a child for an initial period of three months, with options to extend the period to two years or make the adoption permanent.

Hemant Pathak, secretary of Aadharashram Sanstha, detailed the scheme during a lecture organized by Rotary Club Nashik Midtown on "Rehabilitation of Children Through Foster Care." This initiative, designed to complement the legal adoption process, aims to bridge the gap between willing parents and children in need.



Pathak explained that the scheme operates through CARA (Central Adoption Research Authority). It allows couples with a combined age between 70 and 115, as well as single parents aged 35-60, to adopt orphaned children aged 6 to 18. Applicants undergo thorough evaluation of their physical, mental, financial, and emotional capabilities. Stringent checks ensure that neither the adoptive parents nor their immediate family have infectious diseases or criminal backgrounds. After completing the legal for-

malities, children are placed with adoptive parents for three months. This trial period gives both the parents and the child time to adjust. The initial placement can be extended to two years if the parents wish. At the end of the foster care period, parents have the option to make the adoption permanent, he explained further.

Aadharashram in Nashik, the city's only government-approved adoption agency, oversees the process. Prospective parents are required to register on the designated

website, where their details are shared with the District Child Protection Officer for verification. Once cleared, they can select a child based on the profiles and photos provided on the platform, he mentioned.

Pathak also noted that this scheme makes the process more transparent and accessible, encouraging more families to adopt. Information about orphaned children is readily available on the website, making it easier for interested parents to connect with children in need.

Rotary Club Nashik Midtown president Ajay Jadhav welcomed the guests, and secretary Dr. Kiran Birari proposed a vote of thanks. Avtar Singh Panpher, the regional head of Nashik Rotary Clubs, Shirish Bhalerao, and Dr. Chandrashekhar Nampurkar were also present.
