Goods worth Rs. 12 cr seized



NASHIK: During the ongoing State assembly elections, authorities have seized goods worth a staggering Rs. 12 crores, including cash, liquor, drugs, and precious metals. The highest number of seizures has been reported in the Nashik Central constituency, while the least activity has been observed in Na-

shik West.

As the election campaign intensifies, candidates often resort to various tactics to influence voters, prompting government agencies to remain vigilant in enforcing the Model Code of Conduct. There is growing concern about the use of liquor, money, and narcotics to sway voter decisions.

To tackle this, police, state excise, and Election Commission teams are actively monitoring the situation. Despite efforts to block roads and conduct vehicle checks across all 15 constituencies in the district, illegal transportation of goods continues. So far, seizures have amounted to Rs. 11.90 crore, including cash worth Rs. 3.25 crore.

The police and state excise department are focusing on illegal liquor trade, with 3,39,193 liters of liquor worth Rs. 3.52 crore being confiscated. In addition, narcotics worth Rs. 26.74 lakh and precious metals valued at Rs. 1.49 crore have also been seized.

Seized goods:

- Cash: Rs. 3.25 cr
- Liquor: 3,39,193 litres worth Rs. 3.52 cr
- Narcotics: Rs. 26.74 lakh
- Precious metals (gold and silver): Rs. 1.49 cr
- Other goods: Rs. 3.36 cr
- In total, seizures amounting to Rs. 11.90 crore have been made across the district's 15 constituencies.

Ishwari selected for T20 Challenger Trophy

NASHIK: Nashik's Ishwari Savkar has been named to the senior women's cricket team for the T20 Challenger Trophy, organized by the BCCI from November 17 to 27 in Ranchi, Jharkhand. Five teams, labelled Team A to Team E, will compete in the tournament, with players chosen by BCCI's national women's selection



committee. Ishwari, a regular in the Maharashtra senior women's team, has impressed with her aggressive batting as an opener across various age groups. For the past few years, she has consistently been selected for BCCI's National Cricket Academy (NCA) high-performance camps, including the under-23 camp earlier this year. In November 2022,

she showcased her batting skills for India B in a four-way series featuring Sri Lanka, West Indies, India A, and India B. She was also part of the Under-19 Challenger Trophy in 2021. Notably, Ishwari delivered a standout performance in the national one-day matches in Dehradun, scoring a remarkable half-century, and later achieved a century and a half while captaining in a BCCI-organized tournament.

addressing an online lecture organized by the education faculty of Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU) on the topic 'Maulana Azad's Educational Thoughts and Indian Education' to mark Education Day and Children's Day. The programme was presided over by the

university's Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sanjeev Sonawane.

Prof. Wakchoure highlighted Azad's vision of modernizing educational institutions with technical and scientific advancements while integrating agricultural education, reflecting India's agrarian roots. He noted that Azad championed the concept of night

schools to accommodate working-class individuals who toiled throughout the day to support their families.

He expressed concern over current educational trends, where education is often pursued merely for degrees rather than societal development. He criticized the indifference of the educated populace toward voting

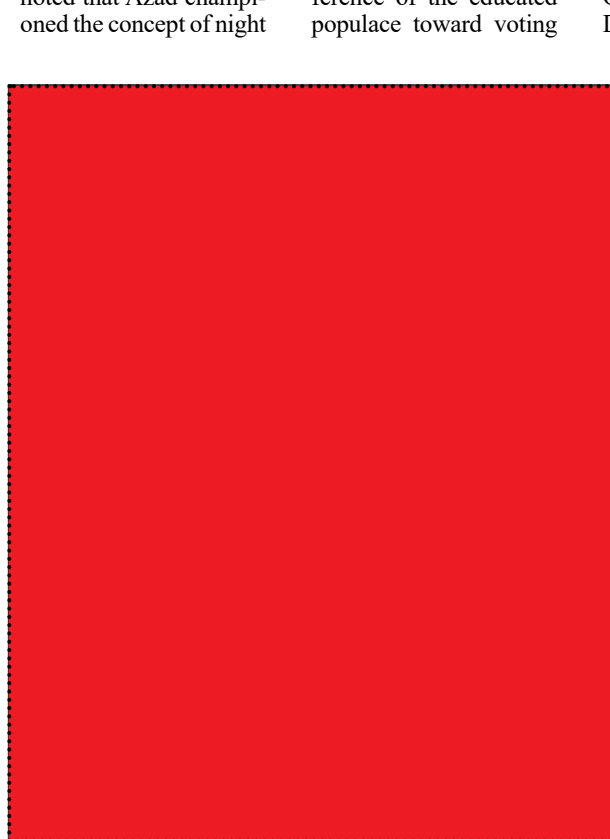
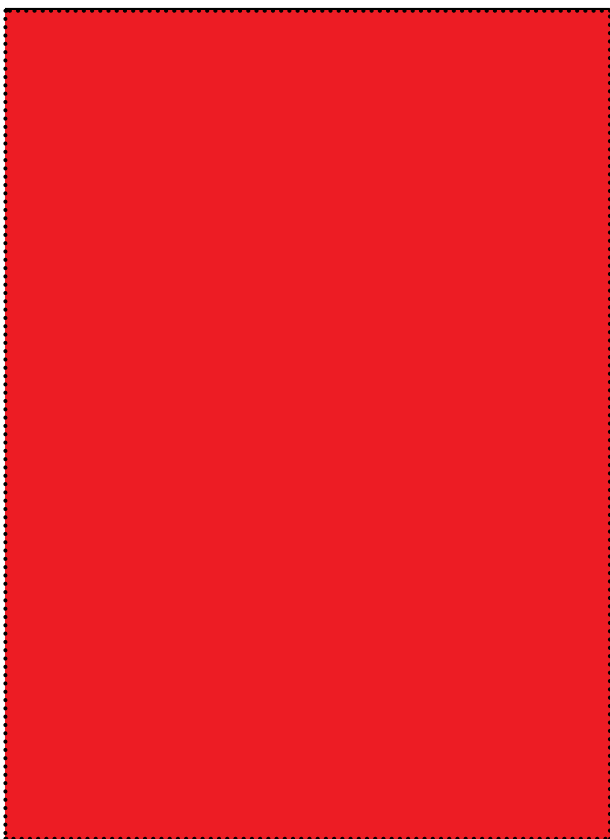

the University's student welfare and external centre, was present. Dr. Sanjeevani Mahale, director of education faculty management board member of the University made the introductory speech. This online lecture session was coordinated, compered by Prof. Vijaykumar Paikrao. He also proposed a vote of thanks.
