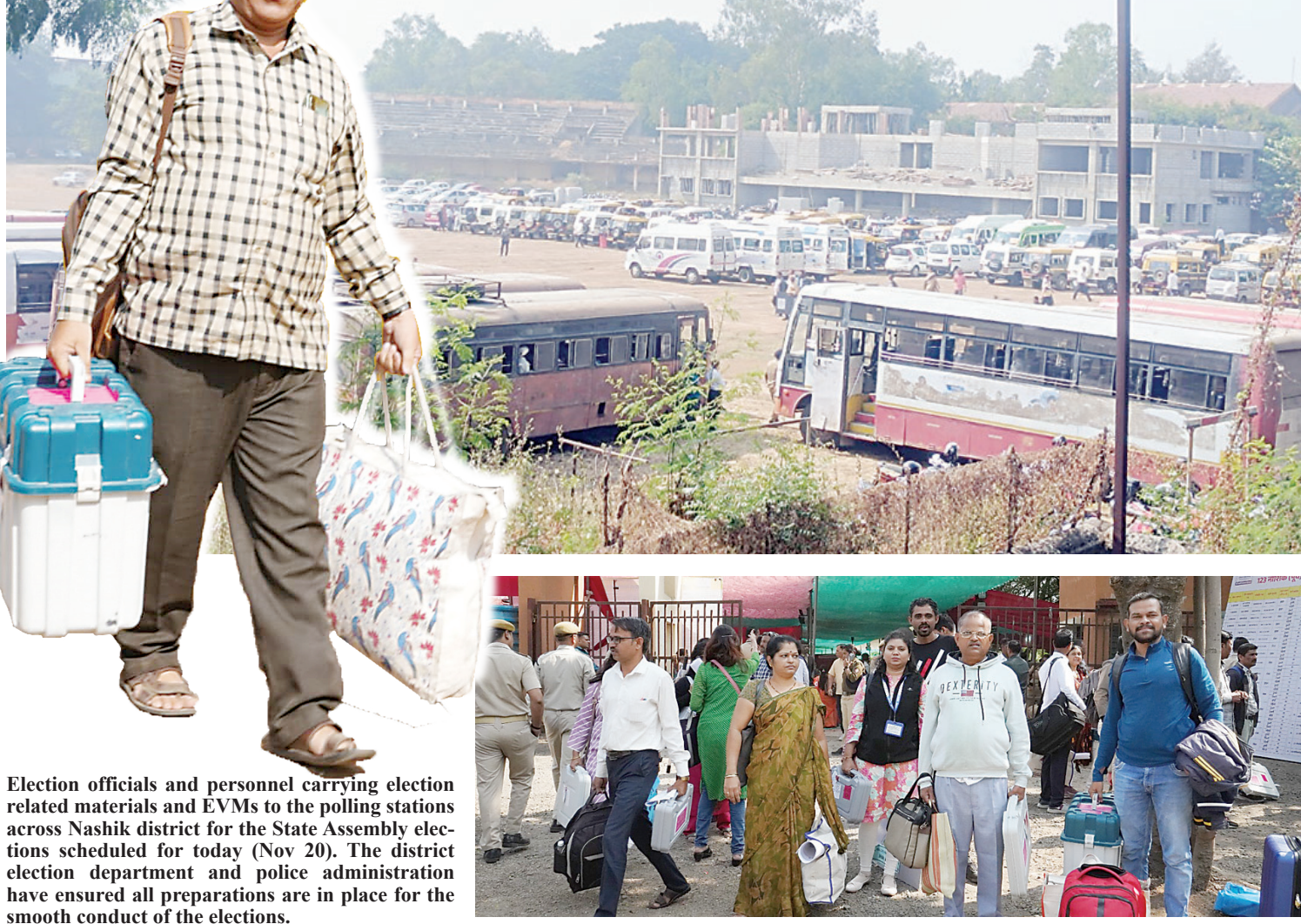

POLLING PREPAREDNESS



Election officials and personnel carrying election related materials and EVMs to the polling stations across Nashik district for the State Assembly elections scheduled for today (Nov 20). The district election department and police administration have ensured all preparations are in place for the smooth conduct of the elections.



Traffic diversions in city

NASHIK: After the polling for four State assembly constituencies in the city and Igatpuri, BU, CU and VVPAT machines will be kept safe in strong rooms at five different places. Due to this, the city traffic department has diverted traffic on the roads in that respective areas and no one will be allowed to enter the roads leading to government girls' school at CBS, Dadasaheb Gaikwad hall in Bhabhanagar, Meenatai Thackeray stadium in Hirawadi, Chhatrapati Sambhaji stadium in Ambad today (Nov. 20th), Saturday (Nov. 23rd). The counting of votes for

those constituencies will take place at these places. Voting related materials and EVM machines will be kept at these places today (Nov 20th) evening. Also, since the vote counting process will begin from 6 am on the Nov 23rd till the completion of the counting, there is a possibility of traffic congestion in this area. Today, the roads leading to these locations will be restricted as voting materials are transported and stored. On Nov 23, when vote counting begins at 6 am, traffic near these locations will also be restricted to avoid congestion.

Road closures and alternate routes

Gaikwad Hall to Hirvenagar
Closed Route: Road along the Nandini river.
Alternate Route: Nagji Signal to Mumbai Naka via Bhabhanagar.
Meenatai Thackeray Stadium area
Closed Route: Road parallel to Mumbai-Agra Highway from Swami Narayan Chowk (New Adgaon Naka) to K K Wagh College.
Alternate Route: Highway under the flyover or Kamalnagar to Hirvenagar-Katya Maruti Chowk.
CBS to Meher Signal Road (Nov 23)
Closed Hours: 6 am to 12 am.

Alternate Route: Traffic diverted via Ashok Stambh to Shalimar through MG Road.
Chhatrapati Sambhaji Stadium area (Nov 23)
Closed Hours: 4 am to 11 pm.
Affected Routes: Mahale Petrol Pump to Simhashtanagar. State Bank Chowk (Mico Hall) to Ratansingh Pardeshi Chowk (St. Lawrence School).

The public is advised to avoid these areas during the restricted hours and use the alternate routes provided. Traffic police will be present to ensure smooth movement in other parts of the city.

Polling Day

Security beefed up in city



NASHIK: Polling for Nashik East, Central, West, and Deolali assembly constituencies is underway today (Nov 20) from 7 am. To ensure law and order, paramilitary forces and police personnel have been deployed across the city, with operations beginning at 10 am on Tuesday. Key sensitive areas, including Bhadrakali, are under heightened security. On the orders of

Commissioner of Police Sandeep Karnik, the following deployments have been made: Armed Police Force (SSB) in Nashik East; Special Arms Force (SAF) in Nashik Central and Railway Protection Force (RPF) in Nashik West. Ganesh Gite of the Maha Vikas Aghadi in Nashik East, the candidate of Mahayuti Rahul Dhikale, Vasant Gite of Maha Vikas Aghadi from Nashik Central, Devyani Pharande of Mahayuti, Dinkar Patil of MNS from Nashik West, Seema Hiray of Mahayuti, Sudhakar Badgujar of Maha Vikas Aghadi, Yogesh Gholap of Maha Vikas Aghadi from Devlali, Saroj Ahire and Sameer Bhujbal from Nandgaon assigned police protection. One or two personnel accompany each candidate.

Global Alliance Against Hunger & Poverty

RIO DE JANEIRO: The Global Alliance Against Hunger and Poverty has officially kicked off its work, Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva said at the opening ceremony of the G20 leaders' summit in Brazil. "I would like to officially announce the launch of the Global Alliance Against Hunger and Poverty," the president said Monday.

Brazil has already got the support of 81 states, 26 international organizations, nine financial institutions, and 31 charities and non-governmental organizations for the endeavour. "We are living alongside 733 million people who are still facing undernourishment. It is as if the populations of Brazil, Mexico, Germany, the United King-

dom, South Africa, and Canada combined were going hungry. In a world that

produces almost 6 billion tons of food per year, this is unacceptable," he said.
