Parking woes in Nashik city Growing vehicle parking crisis



NASHIK: Nashik city faces a growing parking crisis as the number of vehicles increases, causing severe congestion on roads and in market areas. As a major religious destination attracting lakhs of tourists, Nashik's lack of adequate parking has become a pressing concern. Popular commercial hubs such as Mumbai Naka, Pan-

chavati, Dwarka, and Main Road remain hotspots for traffic jams due to improper parking practices. The absence of designated parking spaces forces people to park vehicles on roads, worsening congestion. Plans for parking facilities have repeatedly stalled. A proposal for a multi-storey parking lot at the old CBS site was submit-

ted to the state government during Vasant Gite's tenure as an MLA but failed to progress. Similarly, an idea to use the Zilla Parishad ground near the District Collectorate for parking was abandoned. Under the Smart City mission, some parking areas were identified and earmarked, but these spaces remain unused, leaving the

projects incomplete. **NMC's traffic cell ineffective** Although the NMC established a traffic cell to address congestion, it exists only on paper. Promised projects such as ring roads and smart traffic management systems have seen little progress due to funding shortfalls, space constraints, and le-

gal hurdles. The Municipal Corporation should implement long-overdue solutions like multi-storey and underground parking facilities to address the issue. NMC and public representatives must prioritize parking infrastructure to ease congestion.

Disadvantages of illegal parking

- Improperly parked vehicles slow down traffic flow.
- Ambulances, fire brigades, and police face difficulties in reaching incident sites quickly.
- Blocked views increase the likelihood of accidents.
- Limited access due to illegal parking hampers customer movement in commercial zones.

District admin focuses on branding Nashik: DC Jalaj Sharma

NASHIK: District Collector Jalaj Sharma expressed his confidence in the district's ongoing efforts to brand Nashik alongside industrial development. Speaking at the 'Expectations of Entrepreneurs and Administration regarding Industrial Development of Nashik' seminar, held at NIMA Index 2024 at Thakkar Estate, he highlighted that branding Nashik would gain further momentum with political stability. Sharma also expressed optimism that the long-awaited permanent exhibition centre for Nashik would soon become a reality.

NMRDA Commissioner Manisha Khatri, DCP Monika Raut, Joint Commissioner Shekhar Deshmukh, and other officials were present on the dais. District Collector Sharma outlined various ongoing projects aimed at enhancing Nashik's infrastructure. He pointed out the progress made in air connectivity, with Nashik's international connections seeing growth. The Pune-

Nashik high-speed railway project is in its final stages, with only a few decisions pending. Similarly, land acquisition for the Manmad-Jalgaon fourth railway line will soon be completed. Although work on the Surat-Chennai highway had stalled due to technical issues, Sharma assured that it would resume soon. He also discussed plans to build a heliport on Trimbak Road. Deputy Commissioner of Police Monika Raut addressed the security concerns of industrialists, revealing that a separate police station for Ambad MIDC is under consideration. She also mentioned the expansion of the CCTV network in industrial areas and the development of an app for a safer Nashik, which supports targeted patrolling in identified 'black spots'.

NMRDA Commissioner Manisha Khatri also emphasized the need for a broader network of transport, including Vande Bharat trains and improved air services, to enhance Nashik's overall infrastructure.

100-day TB elimination campaign launched



NASHIK: The 100-day tuberculosis (TB) elimination campaign was officially launched in Nashik district under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme. District Collector Jalaj Sharma inaugurated the campaign yesterday, with key officials including Zilla Parishad CEO Ashima Mittal, Assistant Director Dr. Vijay Dekate, Deputy Director Dr. Kapil Aher, District Surgeon Dr. Charudatt Shinde, District Health Officer Dr. Sudhakar More, and District Tuberculosis Officer Dr. Ravindra Chaudhary were present.

On the occasion, Dr. Ravindra Chaudhary stated the importance of early identification and treatment of TB. He called for a collective effort from all sectors of society to encourage TB patients to adhere to their treatment regimens and seek proper nutrition. He added that the campaign's core objective is to raise awareness about TB and eliminate the disease through a targeted approach. A special drive will focus on densely populated areas to identify patients and offer counselling.

As part of the campaign, Collector Jalaj Sharma also inaugurated a portable X-ray van, which will travel to taluka levels

to conduct TB screenings. The campaign aims to identify and treat as many TB patients as possible, reduce mortality rates, prevent the emergence of new cases, and provide health services to vulnerable groups. Special focus will be given to high-risk populations such as individuals over 60, those with diabetes, smokers, people previously treated for TB, and those in close contact with TB patients, including HIV-infected individuals.

ZP CEO Ashima Mittal highlighted the importance of reaching these high-risk groups during the 100-day campaign to reduce stigma and discrimination related to TB.

This initiative is being implemented in 347 districts across India, including Nashik, with government and semi-government departments collaborating to raise awareness and conduct surveys in targeted areas. Public health officials have committed to creating widespread awareness about TB during the campaign.

'Adisakhi' project Empowering tribal women



NASHIK: The Tribal Development Department, in collaboration with UNICEF and CYDA, has launched the 'Adisakhi' (WashMitra) project aimed at empowering women from Scheduled Tribes. The initiative is designed to create a skilled workforce that will allow tribal women to become economically self-reliant by enabling them to start their own businesses in water, sanitation, and health facility maintenance and repair.

The project focuses on equipping women with skills in various trades, such as plumbing, electrical work, masonry, painting, solar installation, carpentry, and water filter repair. These are essential services regularly needed in ashramshalas (residential schools for tribal children) run by the Tribal Development Department. However, a shortage of skilled workers has often hindered maintenance work, leading to disruptions in services.

By providing training, the 'Adisakhi' project aims to fill this gap and ensure that tribal women have the opportunity to engage in meaningful work while contributing to their communities. With this newly acquired skillset, they will not only assist in the upkeep of ashramshalas but will also have the chance to expand their services to other institutions like anganwadis, colleges, government hospitals, and private establishments.

The first phase of training has already seen 34 women successfully complete their courses, with a total of 120 women set to be trained through the project. On this occasion, Additional Commissioner (Headquarters) Sandeep Golait distributed kits containing the necessary materials to help these women start their own businesses. Sunil Kayande, assistant project officer, Sunil Nerkar, project manager Yogesh Patil and others were also present.

Business opportunities

The 'Adisakhi' project is not only about skill development but also about creating business opportunities for these women. They will be encouraged to start new businesses or work as independent contractors, offering services like maintenance and repairs in ashramshalas, anganwadis, and other public or private establishments. The women will coordinate with principals, superintendents, and staff members to secure contracts and manage their businesses.

Through 'Adisakhi', tribal women have been trained in essential trades like plumbing, electrical work, carpentry, painting, solar, and water filter repair, providing them with a valuable source of income. This initiative will support their families, and we encourage these women to focus on generating employment not only for themselves but also for others in their communities.

Maharashtra's upcoming fixtures in the tournament include matches against Haryana (Dec 8), Uttar Pradesh (Dec 10), Vidarbha (Dec 12), Bihar (Dec 14), and Punjab (Dec 16).

Prachiti powers Nashik to victory

NASHIK: Nashik secured a commanding 56-run win over Warriors in a match of the Maharashtra Cricket Association's State-level Under-19 Women's Invitation League Tournament, held in Pune. The one-day encounter showcased an all-round performance by Nashik, with captain Prachiti Bhawar emerging as the star of the match.

Batting first, Nashik put up a competitive score of 171/9 in their allotted 50 overs. Gauri Gupta anchored the innings with a top score of 39, supported by vital contributions from the middle order. The Warriors bowlers kept the scoring rate in check but failed to restrict Nashik from setting a challenging target.

In the second innings, Nashik's bowlers dominated the Warriors' batting lineup.

Captain Prachiti Bhawar's off-spin proved unplayable, as she claimed five wickets in a stellar 10-over spell, conceding just 31 runs. She was ably supported by Siddhi Pingale, whose left-arm spin brought her three crucial wickets for just 16 runs in 9 overs. The duo dismantled the Warriors, who were bowled out for 115 in 37 overs.

Prachiti's match figures of 10-1-31-5 and Siddhi's 9-1-16-3 underscored Nashik's dominance, both with bat and ball.
