Tackling Nashik's water challenges

Water wastage a concern in New Nashik

NASHIK: While New Nashik enjoys an abundant water supply, concerns are growing about the wastage of this precious resource. Local citizens are urging authorities to address the issue before it becomes a more pressing concern in the future.

In the area governed by the New Nashik Divisional Office of the municipal corporation, approximately 80 to 85 million liters per day (MLD) of water is supplied, sourced from the Mukane and Gangapur dams. This water supply supports a growing population and the increasing demands of the region.

Currently, the area is served by 30 water tanks, and with the rising water needs of residents, plans are underway to construct five additional tanks. The expansion is seen as essential to keep up with the area's growth and ensure reliable water access for all.

Historically, some areas of New Nashik, including Patil Nagar, Sawata Nagar, and Pawan Nagar, faced severe water shortages. In the past, low water pressure led residents to dig pits and fill them with water as a temporary solution. However, thanks to efforts from local representatives, water tanks were installed in these areas, resolving the supply issues.



Branch Engineer Gokul Pagare reported that water supply has been restored to nearly all parts of New Nashik, with the exception of some sections in Ward No. 31. This ward has seen rapid development in recent years, with numerous new buildings constructed, many of which now house residents.

In these large buildings, water tanks are typically installed below ground

level, ensuring a consistent water supply. However, in areas with row houses, water tanks are often placed on rooftops, leading to supply challenges. To address these issues, the construction of a new water tank in Ward 31 is currently underway. Pagare assured that once this project is completed, along with ongoing work on water channels, the water supply issues in the area will be fully resolved.

Despite these improvements, a significant issue persists: water wastage. Areas such as Trimurti Chowk, Patil Nagar, Sawata Nagar, Pawan Nagar, Uttam Nagar, Shivpuri Chowk, Vijay Nagar, and Upendra Nagar are witnessing excessive water waste. Residents, when supplied with tap water, often use it to wash roads or clean their vehicles, leading to substantial water loss.

Experts emphasize the need for citizens to be more mindful of their water usage, particularly when using hoses to wash cars. The continuous flow of water during such activities wastes large quantities, contributing to the overall issue of water scarcity. Local authorities and community leaders are urging the public to adopt more responsible water usage practices to help conserve this vital resource for the future.

Bhusawal Division achieves record non-fare revenue

NASHIK: Bhusawal Division has achieved a commendable milestone by surpassing its Non-Fare Revenue (NFR) target well ahead of the financial year 2024-25's conclusion. By December 15, 2024, the division recorded an impressive Rs. 5.46 crore in NFR, reflecting 1.92% higher than the FY 2024-25 target and 16.51% growth over last year's revenue.

This achievement highlights the division's unwavering focus on diversifying revenue streams and leveraging innovative approaches for sustainable growth. The NFR revenue generated showcases the robust potential of diverse non-fare revenue sources and underlines Bhusawal Division's commitment to create lucrative opportunities for businesses to reach a vast audience while enhancing the travel experience for passengers.

Parcel Scanner at Nashik Road Station is a unique ini-

tiative focused on enhancing security and revenue. Generates Rs. 2.35 lakh annually. Further working on the same lines Bhusawal Division has floated tenders for projects expected to add Rs. 1.48 crore to revenue, including Outsourcing of waiting rooms for wom-



en, at Nashik Road, Cleaning of BOXN wagons at Bhusawal Yard, Establishing a Rail Coach Restaurant at Shegaon and Dhule, and Onboard vending of miscellaneous items on the Bhusawal-Nashik section.

Research projects should benefit society: Dr. Sankapal



NASHIK: Students undertaking research projects must select topics with care, ensuring their work contributes positively to society, emphasized Prof. Dr. B R Sankapal, an eminent scientist from Visvesvaraya National Institute of Technology (VNIT), Nagpur.

Dr. Sankapal was addressing a guidance workshop organized at KTHM College to enhance the research skills of students and professors. The event is part of the college's ongoing efforts to promote

quality research and publication practices.

During his address, Dr. Sankapal elaborated on several critical aspects of research. He outlined the steps for effectively presenting and writing research projects and detailed the care required in drafting research papers. Key topics included the structure of a research paper, innovative referencing techniques, and the classification of papers based on their impact factor.

He stressed the impor-

tance of choosing socially relevant topics, particularly when seeking financial assistance for research. "Proposals should prioritize topics with societal benefits," he remarked, adding that such considerations often influence the approval process.

Dr. Sankapal provided insights into various organizations that offer financial support for research projects, including: SERB (Science and Engineering Research Board), DST (Department of Science and Technology),

DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation), CSIR (Council of Scientific and Industrial Research), DBT (Department of Biotechnology), ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation), BIRAC (Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council), and AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education). He also explained the procedures for submitting online proposals, encouraging students and faculty to take advantage of these opportunities.

The workshop saw the participation of the college's Principal, Dr. S. S. Kale, Vice Principal, Dr. N. D. Gaikwad, and faculty members of the science department. Principal Dr. Kale welcomed the guests and shared insights on research activities across universities. Prof. Sneha Buwa moderated the program, ensuring its smooth conduct, while Dr. Ganesh Mogal delivered the vote of thanks.

NASHIK: Satyajeet Bachhav, the talented left-arm spinner from Nashik, has once again been selected to represent the Maharashtra team in the prestigious Vijay Hazare Trophy. Known for his consistency and match-winning performances, Satyajeet continues to be a vital part of the team in this one-day, 50-over cricket tournament organized annually by the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI).

This year, the Maharashtra team will play its league

matches in Mumbai between December 21 and January 5, under the captaincy of Ruturaj Gaikwad.

Satyajeet has been a cornerstone of the Maharashtra team across all formats, including the Ranji Trophy, Syed Mushtaq Ali T20, and Vijay Hazare Trophy. Since making his Vijay Hazare debut in March 2017, he has played 40 matches and taken an impressive 68 wickets. Beyond his bowling skills, he has also contributed valuable

runs as a lower-order batsman.

In the Maharashtra Premier League earlier this year, Satyajeet emerged as the top wicket-taker, earning the coveted Vasant Ranjane Purple Cap with 25 wickets. He was also honored with the Maharashtra Cricket Association's Best Cricketer Award in 2022.
