tra and even internationally. Organized annually on the second Saturday of January, the initiative aims to assist the underprivileged and has seen continuous success over the past 22 years. Daily Deshdoot and Deshdoot Times editor Dr. Vaishali Balajiwale interacted with 'Nashik Run' charitable trust's vice chair-

man Mukund Bhat, treasurer Rajaram Kasar and general secretary Anil Daithankar during daily Deshdoot's Samwad Katta initiative.

The initiative was originally launched by major industrial players like Bosch, TDK, and Thyssen Group with the goal of improving the lives of the less fortunate in the region. Funds raised through the event support various sectors including education, health, sports,

and the arts. Last year alone, the initiative contributed over Rs. 1 crore

The trust has undertaken a range of development projects, such as building classrooms, renovating dining rooms, and constructing toilets at schools like the one in Vaitarna. Additionally, 35 bicycles were provided to help students, particularly girls, attend school more regularly, they said. Nashik Run has always maintained transparency in its spending, with all other event-related expenses covered by the organizing industrial groups. Employees
