Grand finale of National School Band Competition Bhonsala girls from Nashik selected

NASHIK: The grand finale of the National School Band Competition 2024-25, held as part of the Republic Day celebrations, is scheduled for January 24 and 25, 2025, at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi.

Two schools from Maharashtra have made it to the grand finals, including Bhonsala Military School Girls, Nashik, representing the Western Zone. The other school from the region is Rajarambapu Patil Military School and Sports Academy, Islampur, Sangli.

This competition aims to foster patriotism and unity among students, with 16 school band teams qualifying for the finals. These include Boys Brass Band, Girls Brass Band, Boys Pipe Band, and Girls Pipe Band, with a total of 466 participants.

Senior armed forces officers will serve as judges, evaluating the performances of the bands. The winners will be honored by the Minister of State for Defence, Sanjay Seth, on January 25. The competition promises to be a celebration of talent and patriotism

as the selected schools compete for top honors.

- ❑ **First prize:** Rs. 21,000, trophy, and certificate
- ❑ **Second prize:** Rs. 16,000, trophy, and certificate
- ❑ **Third prize:** Rs. 11,000, trophy, and certificate
- ❑ **Remaining teams:** Rs. 3,000 each

Performances will be evaluated by the Jury appointed by the Ministry of Defence including members from each wing of the Armed Forces. From RDC 2023 onwards, the National School Band Competition is being jointly conducted by the Ministry of Defence and the Ministry of Education. A School Band evokes a feeling of oneness, belonging and pride in school children towards their school and country. The rhythm of a band rouses passion, courage and action in children and adults alike. The Competition consists of three levels [State Level, Zonal Level, & National Level (final)] in four categories (Boys Brass Band, Girls Brass Band, Boys Pipe Band and Girls Pipe Band). Building on the success of last year's competition, the Competition garnered significant enthusiasm this year. Over 700 school band teams from 34 States/Union Territories (UTs) registered for the competition at the State Level, in which 568 teams comprising around 14,000 children participated.

NASHIK: Nashik is all set to witness four days of thrilling cricket action. The Ranji Trophy match between Maharashtra and Baroda begins today, running from January 23

to 26, 2025, at the newly renovated Hutatma Anant Kanhere Ground, Golf Club Nashik. Organized by the BCCI, the four-day encounter promises to be a treat for cricket enthusiasts.

Both teams dedicated yesterday to rigorous practice sessions. Maharashtra, led by captain Raturaj Gaikwad,

began their session at 9 a.m., starting with football warm-ups before diving into batting and bowling drills under head coach Harshad Khadiwale and assistant coach Amit Patil.

The Baroda team, led by captain Krunal Pandya, began their practice at 10 a.m., with head coach Mukund Parmar, bowling coach Arvind

Srinath, and fielding coach Himanshu Jadhav fine-tuning the players' skills.

The match inauguration at 8:30 a.m. will see prominent figures such as Maharashtra Cricket Association President Rohit Pawar, Divisional Commissioner Praveen Gedam, District Collector Jalaj Sharma, and other dignitaries in
