Five dead, 45 injured in bus accident

NASHIK: A tragic accident occurred early on Sunday morning when a private luxury bus, carrying pilgrims from Madhya Pradesh, plunged into a 200-foot gorge at Malegaon Ghat on the Nashik-Gujarat Highway. At least five people were killed, including two women, and 45 others were injured.

The deceased passengers were identified as Ratanlal Deviram Jatav (41), Bolaram Posaram Kusva (55), Guhiben Rajeshbhai Yadav (60), Bjiendra Badal Yadav (55), and Kamles Bhai Yadav (60), all residents of Madhya Pradesh. The injured passengers were immediately rushed to two primary health centres: 21 injured passengers were admitted to the health center at Sharnavhan, while 24 others were taken to the health center at Ahava.

Among the injured were a number of individuals, including Champabhai, Shantibhai, Birpal Singh, Sumla, Gulabbhai, Raj Kumari, Sudha Veragai, Idhar-

van, Genshibai, Charandas Shoor Singh, Shri Kumari (65), Blum Bai Phulsingh, Balram Watva, Ranveer Singh Chhapna (60), Ka-



Mithalais, Ramesh Raju Berari (58), Ranveer Singh Yadav (55), rai Mohan (50), Karan Singh, Kailai, Amaribai Kailasbai Yadav

The bus was part of a group of pilgrims from the Trimbakeshwar temple in Maharashtra to Dwarka, Gujarat. The group of devotees, hailing from the districts of Guna, Shivpuri, and Ashoknagar in Madhya Pradesh, had embarked on a religious journey to visit various pilgrimage sites across Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Gujarat.

Superintendent of Police SG Patil confirmed that the accident took place around dawn when the driver reportedly lost control of the vehicle near the Saputara hill station, causing the bus to veer off the road and plunge into the deep gorge.
