### India leg of trophy tour concludes

**NEW DELHI:** The India leg of trophy tour of the ICC Champions Trophy has concluded, with the coveted prize visiting Mumbai and Bengaluru ahead of the tournament set to begin on February 19. The upcoming edition of the eight-team, 50-over tournament will be held in Pakistan and Dubai from February 19 to March 9.

"The Trophy Tour has visited all eight participating nations during its global journey, and with the conclusion of the India leg, it will now make its final stop in Pakistan," the ICC said in a statement on Monday. In Mumbai, the trophy visited iconic locations such as Wankhede Stadium, Shivaji Park, the Gateway of India, Carter Road, the historic Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus, and Bandstand, among others. It was also displayed during the 50th anniversary celebrations of Wankhede Stadium.

In Bengaluru, the trophy toured venues including Nexus Shantiniketan Mall, Bengaluru Palace, Freedom Park, KR Market, Town Hall, St. Mary's Basilica, M Chinnaswamy Stadium, Church Street, and Vidyarthi Bhavan.

## **Arsenal thrash Man City**

LONDON: Arsenal moved to within six points of Premier League leaders Liverpool by thrashing Manchester City at Emirates Stadium. The Gunners, who knew only a victory would suffice with Liverpool opening a commanding lead at the top of the table after winning at Bournemouth, responded by overpowering the fading champions in emphatic fashion, the BBC reported.

Arsenal have played a game more than Liverpool, but this impressive victory at least means they remain within touching distance of Arne Slot's pacesetters.

City, as they had done against Chelsea eight days previously, gifted their opponents an early lead, this time inside two minutes when defender Manuel Akanji lost possession, Arsenal captain Martin Odegaard then steering in Kai Havertz's pass.

Arsenal were wondering whether they would regret Havertz's dreadful first-half miss when Erling Haaland headed City level after 55 minutes, but their lead was restored within two minutes when Thomas Partey's shot was deflected wide of keeper Stefan Ortega off John Stones.

And the points were made safe after 62 minutes as 18-year-old Myles Lewis-Skelly



fired home his first goal for Arsenal, Ortega getting a hand to his powerful shot but failing to keep it out.

As City crumbled once more in this season of turmoil, Havertz made up for his earlier miss by steering a precise left-foot finish into the far corner past Ortega with 14 minutes left.

It got even better for Arsenal as 17-yearold Ethan Nwaneri, picked out superbly by Declan Rice, bent a fabulous shot into the

## Manufacturing PMI surges

NEW DELHI: India's factory activities picked pace in January 2025 with the manufacturing purchasing managers' index (PMI) climbing to nearly a six-month high of 57.7 during the month on the back of strong export orders. India's man-

ufacturing PMI, compiled by S&P Global, had fallen to a one-year low of 56.4 in December 2024, reflecting weak factory activities during the month.

A PMI print below 50 means contraction, while above it shows expansion in activities. The rate of expansion in

manufacturing activities during January this year was the quickest since last July and outpaced its long-run average.

"Following a moderation in growth during December, Indian goods producers kicked off 2025 on a robust note. With new orders rising at the quickest pace since last July, fuelled by the steepest upturn in exports in nearly 14 years, there was a stronger expansion in output. January data also showed a pick-up in growth of buying levels and record job creation," the private survey said



Cost pressures retreated to their weakest in 11 months during January this year, but selling prices rose solidly amid buoyant demand. Mean-

while, business confidence strengthened. Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, said, 'India's final manufacturing PMI marked a six-month high in January. Domestic and export demand were both strong, supporting new orders growth. The

mployment PMI suggested robust job creation in the manufacturing industry, as the index increased to its highest level since the series was created."

Bhandari further said, "Inout cost inflation eased for a second month, relieving pressure on manufacturers to raise final output prices."

The HSBC India Manufacturing PMI is compiled by S&P Global from responses to questionnaires sent to purchas-

ing managers in a panel of around 400 manufacturers. It is one of the closely watched high-frequency data by economists, markets, and policymakers.
