# KKR beat DC

NEW **DELHI:** Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) pulled off a 14-run win over Delhi Capitals (DC) in a high-octane IPL 2025 encounter at the Arun Jaitley Stadium on Tuesday. Chasing a daunting 205-run target, DC ended their innings at 190 for 9, with veteran Faf du Plessis top-scoring with 62 runs. KKR's win was powered by solid batting contributions, spirited bowling, and a dramatic final over by Mitchell Starc.

After being asked to bat first by DC skipper Rishabh Pant, KKR got off to a rollicking start. Openers Rahmanullah Gurbaz and Sunil Narine came out all guns blazing. Gurbaz smashed 26 off just 12 deliveries, including five boundaries and a six, while Narine matched the aggression with 27 off 16. The duo brought up the fastest team fifty of the season-reaching the mark in just 3.4 overs—setting the tone for a big total.

However, the momentum was interrupted when Mitchell Starc dismissed Gurbaz with a searing yorker, inducing a sharp edge to wicketkeeper Abishek Porel. Narine soon departed, falling

to left-arm spinner Axar Patel. Ajinkya Rahane (26 off 14) also perished as KKR slumped from 85/1 to 91/3, with Vipraj Nigam picking up key wickets.

KKR's innings regained composure through a steady partnership between youngster Angkrish Raghuvanshi and the dependable Rinku Singh. Raghuvanshi compiled a mature 44 from 32 deliveries, hitting three fours and two sixes, while Rinku added 36 off 25. The pair rotated the strike well and added crucial runs in the middle overs. But both were dismissed in quick succession, with Rinku's wicket falling to an outstanding catch by Starc at long-on.

In response, Delhi Capitals struggled to maintain momentum in the steep chase. Faf du Plessis played a lone hand at the top, scoring a gritty 62 runs, but regular wickets kept pegging DC back.

berth. The wash out of PBKS last match has given little hope for CSK in its fortune revival as it needs to win all the remaining matches with massive margins and also hope that the top teams in the table lose their remaining contests triggering an equation for the play offs spot.

For that, CSK, which had tried several combinations right from the top order and shuffled its battling line up, need to get its balance right, while PBKS rides high on confidence having being placed ahead of its rivals in the table that would give enough cushion for it.

The pitch, which had so far favoured the seamers unlike assisting the traditional spinners, might hold the key CSK for its fortunes to turn.

If the 22-yard strip behaves true to its tradition, Dhoni could bring in offie Ashwin to strengthen the spin attack to share with all rounder Ravindra Jadeja, while not tinkering with the pacers led by Khaleel Ahmed and Mukesh Choudhry with Anshul Kamboj providing the support with slinger Matheesha Pathirana.

On the batting front, CSK will persist with teenager Mhatre, who shone briefly but brightly in his earlier encounter with SRH, which it easily won, while Dewald Brevis after his debut, looking solid in the middle.

Return of Devon Conway could not be ruled out to pair with Shaik Rasheed/or bringing back Rachin Ravindra at the top.

# Youth Table Tennis C'ships

# **Indian paddlers bag** 13 gold medals

KOLKATA: India concluded the 2025 South Asian Youth Table Tennis Championships in Kathmandu, Nepal, with an impressive haul of 13 gold and three silver medals, Table Tennis Federation of India (TFFI).

The qualification event for this year's Youth Asian Championships saw the Indian contingent dominate the competition across various categories on Sunday.

The Indian teams grabbed three gold medals in the Under-19 Girls, Under-15 Boys, and Under-15 Girls sections and made a clean sweep of all six golds in the U-19 and U-15 doubles, including the mixed doubles events. Additionally, India secured four singles golds in the U-19 Boys and Girls categories. However, the hosts Nepal

claimed the fourth gold in the U-19 Boys category. Despite a lone loss to Pakistan in the five-team league phase, Nepal finished on top with seven points, securing three wins and edging out Sri Lanka and Bangladesh, who took second and

### third place, respectively.

India, having qualified for the Youth Asian Youth Championships last year, did not have to field its squad in the competition.

In the team events, Pritha Vartikar, Ananya Chande, Hardee Patel, and Diya Bramhachary clinched the U-19 Girls' gold, defeating Nepal 3-1. Prateeti Paul, Aarushi Nandi, Advika Arawal, and Tanmayee Saha triumphed in the U-15 Girls' category, thrashing Sri Lanka 3-0.

In the U-15 Boys' event, Atharva Nawrnge, Vishruth Ramakrishnan, Akash Rajavelu, and Prateek Tulsani dominated the competition, winning all their league-phase matches to top the group and remain undefeated for the gold. In the U-19 Boys' singles final, Kushal Chopda triumphed over fellow Indian R. Balamurugan 3-1 to claim the gold, as the Indians secured the top two spots. In the U-19 Girls' singles, Ananya Chande defeated Pritha Vartikar 3-1 to take the gold, leaving Pritha with the silver.

## **HI congratulates PR Sreejesh**

**NEWDELHI:**Hockey India (HI) has extended its warmest congratulations to PR Sreejesh, former Indian men's hockey team goalkeeper and the current coach of the Indian junior men's team, for being honoured with the Padma Bhushan, India's thirdhighest civilian award.

This remarkable recognition places Sreejesh alongside the legend-ary Major Dhyan Chand, making him only the second hockey player in history to receive the Padma Bhushan. Dhyan Chand was bestowed with this honour in 1956, and nearly seven decades later, Sreejesh's contribution to Indian hockey earns him a place among the greats.

Celebrated as the "God of Modern Indian Hockey," Sreejesh enjoyed a glittering 18-year inter-

national career, earning 336 caps for India before bidding farewell to professional hockey after the Paris 2024 Olympics. True to form, he delivered a series of stunning performances to help India clinch a bronze medal, following up on the historic bronze win at Tokyo 2020.

Throughout his distinguished career, Sreejesh collected numerous accolades, including the FIH Goalkeeper of the Year Award three times (2021, 2022, and 2024), the Arjuna Award in 2015, the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award in 2021, and the World Games Athlete of the Year in 2021. Since making his senior international debut in 2010, he became a backbone of the Indian defense, known for his composure and brilliance under pressure.

**Snooker World C'ship** 

LONDON: Chinese ace Ding Junhui was knocked out of the Snooker World Championship 13-4 by Luca Brecel while his younger compatriot Si Jiahui reached the quarterfinals for a second time.

Ding, 38, was one frame away from elimination before Monday's final session as he trailed behind the 2023 world champion Brecel 12-4.

The Belgian then needed just 15 minutes and a break of 71 to claim the victory on Monday, setting up a quarterfinal clash with world No.1 Judd Trump.

With 15 ranking titles in his pocket, Ding hasn't been able to win the trophy of the World Championship. This year, he saw off debutant Zak Surety of Germany 10-7 to reach the second round of this prestigious event for the first time in five years.

Meanwhile, the 22-year-old Si went further at the Crucible Theatre after defeating Britain's Ben Woollaston 13-10.The world No. 13 Si will fight for a semifinal berth against Ronnie O'Sullivan after the seven-time world champion of Britain outplayed China's Pang Junxu 13-4.

The bus will set off from Allerton Maze at 14:30 BST on May 26 before travelling along a nine-mile (15km) route including Queens Drive and The Strand before finishing on Blundell Street.

Hundreds of thousands of fans are expected to line the route to celebrate with Arne Slot and his title-winning squad. The parade, which is being organised by Liverpool City Council, is expected to last between three and five hours, the BBC reported. Council leader Liam Robinson said: "We're delighted to officially invite Liverpool Football Club to parade around the city on 26 May.

more than football - it's a celebration of our city's pride, passion and community spirit."

Robinson said it was going to be a "bumper weekend in Liverpool", adding that a huge amount of work had already been done behind the scenes in preparation.

Thousands of music fans will also be heading to Sefton Park for BBC Radio 1's Big Weekend from Friday 23 to Sunday 25 May inclusive. Liverpool will end their Premier League campaign on May 25 when Crystal Palace visit Anfield. Rivals Everton play away on the final day of the season, a week after bidding an emotional farewell to their Goodison Park home.
